



Summer school: 1-8 September 2024 ASIAN ANGLO LIFE WRITING Mulhouse, Alsace (France)

The Asian Anglo Life Writing summer school is hosted at the University of Upper Alsace (Université de Haute-Alsace, UHA), a public teaching and research university located in Mulhouse, France. UHA is part of a trinational cross-border university alliance (EUCOR) that includes the Swiss, French, and German universities of Basel, Mulhouse, Strasbourg, Freiburg, and the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology. This collaboration reflects UHA's high academic standards and geographical advantages, as Mulhouse is a border city located next to Switzerland and Germany.

The summer school welcomes applicants from the Greater China region, regardless of their career stage—be it postgraduates, postdocs, early-career scholars, or established professionals. In Mulhouse, participants will engage with the summer school faculty, a group of experts from various Asian and European institutions, including professors, journal editors, and writers. The theme of the summer school is Life Writing, a genre that includes writings about personal memories, experiences, opinions, emotions, and more. Notably, the autobiography genre, along with subgenres such as biography, memoir, diary, letter, testimony, and personal essays, are all forms of life writing. During the summer school, we will explore the study of life writing, with a particular focus on Asian Anglophone life writings. This includes both literary classics written by authors such as Maxine Hong Kingston, as well as more recent works by emerging Asian American and Asian Diaspora authors. In addition to written texts such as novels, the summer school will also cover topics like comics, as well as popular music and lyrics by artists such as Coco Lee and Leehom Wang.

The structure of the summer school consists of a series of lectures and seminars, as well as cultural activities, including visits to local sites in Mulhouse, the art museum in Basel, Switzerland, the Cathedral of Strasbourg, France, and wine tasting at a French vineyard, among others. It also includes an academic publishing workshop, where participants can meet journal editors and book series editors from reputable journals and academic publishers to discuss strategies for publishing internationally. The summer school will conclude with a one-day symposium where participants are invited to present their work-in-progress and receive feedback from the faculty members.
